Josh Leadingfox

Josh LeadingFox is a member of the Pawnee Nation of Oklahoma and a descendant of the Otoe-Missouria Tribe. He spent most of his early life in his hometown of Pawnee. He grew up attending Pawnee Indian Baptist Church under the leadership of Duane Pratt and sons, Bruce and Jr. Pratt.

During Indian Falls Creek 1996, Josh accepted Christ as his savior and remained active in his home church until his graduation from Pawnee High School in 2002. He was an Oklahoma state champion wrestler and was blessed to receive a wrestling scholarship to the University of Central Oklahoma. While competing at UCO, he was a two-time All-American and member of two National Championship wrestling teams. He graduated from UCO in 2007.

In 2005, while in college, he surrendered his life to the call of preaching ministry at Indian Falls Creek. He served as Associate Pastor at First Indian Baptist Church of Edmond, Oklahoma, from 2008 to 2011. God then called him to First Seminole Baptist Church in Immokalee, Florida, in July of 2011, where he has served as pastor since.

Josh married his wife Lyndsey (Creek/Seminole/Cherokee), an OBU graduate, in 2007, and they have five beautiful children, daughters: Layla, Ava, Mila, and Jemma, and son Joshua Jr.

SWIMMING

Swimming is allowed at the Entrance Creek and the Baptist Lake. No mixed swimming allowed. Mother and child groups should swim during the girls' time and fathers and their child should swim during the boys' time. Daily swim hours are 1:30 to 4:00 PM, and the location is alternated between boys and girls daily.

Robes or towels must be worn to and from the cabin. Lifeguards will be on duty at both locations. Life jackets are required for all swimmers and will be provided. Kayaks and paddle boats are available at the Entry Creek. Floating inflatable toys are located at both swimming areas.

General Information

SHUTTLE SERVICE

There will be a shuttle service available again this year. It will be available to assist seniors or campers who need that extra help getting to and from services. Carts will begin transporting 45 minutes before each worship service. Wave down a cart or request a pickup in the Program Office.

Not all carts are tasked for transporting campers, please be patient and understanding until a cart in service is available.

PROGRAM OFFICE

The Program Office is located in the Missions Center. The program office will be open from 8 AM - 12 PM, 1:30 PM - 5 PM, and 9 PM -10 PM Monday through Thursday. While the Program Office is closed there will be someone there for emergencies.

CONCESSION STANDS

The daily hours of operation for the concession stands are 10:30 -11:00 AM and 1:00 - 5:00 PM. The stands will open immediately following the evening worship services and close at 10:00 PM.

THE CHALLENGE

All churches are encouraged to participate in as many special activities, events, and volunteer opportunities as possible. By participating churches receive points and the Top 10 churches at the end of week will receive a prize. Tally sheets will be available starting Sunday evening.

ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING

The annual business meeting will be held Thursday at 2:00 PM in the Mathena Family Event Center. Each church will need to register two messengers to attend. Messengers can register in the program office until Wednesday Evening.

Code of Conduct

GENERAL PURPOSE

Indian Falls Creek has been planned for the whole family from infants to elders. The code of conduct for Indian Falls Creek is intended to assist the many diverse churches and campers to have a safe and enjoyable camp experience, while growing in their faith. Indian Falls Creek is a Christian camp designed to help students and adults know and follow God, so the code of conduct prioritizes personal encouragement and issues related to a camper's faith development in Jesus. Indian Falls Creek does not condone or encourage any activity on grounds that would humiliate any camper, including initiation; hazing, and/or pranks. Furthermore, Indian Falls Creek will not tolerate any activity that would harm any camper such as violence or abuse.

CURFEW

By 10 pm, all campers should return to their cabin for evening cabin devotional and should not be outside their cabin without a sponsor until the morning session. Lights out by 11 pm.

VEHICLES

- •Unnecessary and careless traffic is prohibited on Falls Creek grounds.
- •Only Conference Center operated golf carts, utility carts, or low speed vehicles (LSVs) are permitted.
- •Delivery trucks are not permitted during summer camp weeks except to supply Conference Centerowned concessions.
- •All passengers must be seated in a vehicle according to its designated capacity-no passengers are allowed in pickup beds or in the back of vehicles with hatch doors raised.
- •All cycles (uni-, bi-, or tri-) are prohibited on the grounds. Violation of this policy could result in confiscation of equipment. Motorcycles may only drive to and from the gate to their cabin or meeting place.

CELL PHONES

•Indian Falls Creek asks that church leaders make determinations regarding their students' use and possession of cell phones. NOTE: The majority of group leaders limit the time students are allowed to use their cell phones each day in order to cause less distraction from the camp experience.

CAMP REQUIREMENTS

- •Campers are required to attend Bible Classes and Skills Classes and both Morning and Evening Worship Service each day. Please note the change in the class format this year.
- •Sponsors from each church are responsible for enforcing the code of conduct and camp dress code for their entire group (students, sponsors, and guests) and for handling discipline issues within their group.
- •Courtesy Crew will be on duty 24 hours per day. Courtesy Crew, when called upon, will assist the adult leadership of any cabin in dealing with discipline problems that may arise. Although the Courtesy Crew is specifically assigned to the duty of enforcement, all Indian Falls Creek and Falls Creek Summer Staff members are authorized to enforce the code of conduct, dress code, and policies of Falls Creek Conference Centers. Please respect all Indian Falls Creek and Falls Creek Summer Staff.
- •Church groups must sit together at all worship services. Indian Falls Creek staff will actively enforce this requirement.
- •All guests are required to show proof of registration or ID to enter or re-enter the Falls Creek grounds. Drive-in guests should leave grounds by midnight.

MODESTY /PDA

Believing that modesty extends beyond the dress code, Indian Falls Creek asks that students refrain from PDA (Public Displays of Affection). Church sponsors should be diligent to communicate this guideline to their students.

CAMP PROHIBITIONS

- •Students will not be permitted to leave the grounds unless accompanied by a sponsor.
- •No bands or instrumental groups are allowed to perform outside their cabin walls, except for groups that are an official part of the weekly programming for the whole camp.
- •Excessive volume from a cabin is not permitted since it can disturb other cabins. Please check with the office, located in the Jordan Welcome Center, if there is an issue.
- •No product sales are allowed at Indian Falls Creek unless they have secured a contract through the Falls Creek Conference Centers.
- •Use or possession of illegal drugs, alcohol, or tobacco of any type is not permitted on the grounds. This includes e-cigarettes, vaping or other facsimiles. Falls Creek Conference Centers is a smoke free facility.
- •The possession of offensive weapons of any sort is prohibited at Falls Creek Camp. Falls Creek Conference Centers reserves the right to perform a random drug and weapon search at any time and confiscate items that distract from the camp goals or that violate the code of conduct of the camp.
- •Open flame items (other than grills) such as campfires, tiki torches, etc., are not permitted on grounds, unless prepared and supervised by the Falls Creek Conference Centers.
- •Pets/animals (other than service dogs), fireworks, rock throwing, water fighting, laser pointers, and shaving cream fights are prohibited on the grounds.
- •Masks or any other disguise over the face cannot be worn by anyone outside of their cabin. Masks that cover the nose and mouth will be permitted.
- •For the safety of all guests, skates, roller-blades, and skateboards are permitted only in the SwiftSkate Park area and only at designated times.
- •No wading or swimming is allowed in the creeks or lake unless there is a Falls Creek Camp lifeguard present. No swimming/wading pools are allowed at cabins.
- •No camera drones or remote controlled flying devices may be operated on grounds without expressed permission from the Director of Falls Creek Conference Centers and the Indian Falls Creek Executive Director.

DRESS CODE

- •Shoes must be worn at all times outside of your cabin.
- •Apparel may not display or promote tobacco, alcohol, controlled substances, or inappropriate language or pictures.
- •Undergarments must always be covered by outer garments (i.e. No boxer shorts hanging out or bra straps showing).
- •Midriffs should always be covered.
- ·No spaghetti strap shirts or dresses .
- No tank tops.
- •Shorts must be of modest length. Note: modest length can be generally defined as extending to just beyond the fingertips, which in general is no shorter than 5 to 7 inch inseam.
- •No tight fitting and revealing clothing. This includes leggings or similar attire, which cannot be worn as pants.
- •Girls may wear dresses/skirts, but they must reach the top of the knee.

SWIM ATTIRE

- •Girls should wear modest one-piece swim suits. Males should not wear tight fitting swimming suits.
- •While going to and from the swimming areas, all campers must wear shoes; males must wear a t-shirt and females must wear a long covering over their swimming suits.

Daily Devotionals

Sunday

²²Immediately he made the disciples get into the boat and go ahead of him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. ²³After dismissing the crowds, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. Well into the night, he was there alone.

Matthew 14:22-23

Jesus made a regular practice of carving out time to be alone with the Father. Just as Adam and Eve walked and talked daily with God in the cool of the even-ing in the garden of Eden, Jesus modeled for us what it looks like to prioritize continual conversation with the Father.

You've been given the opportunity this week to get away from your normal routines to commune with God and fellowship with other followers of Jesus at Fall Creek. I encourage you to use this week wisely, to give extra attention to listening to what God is saying to you. He'll speak to you through His Word, while you are praying to Him, during Bible study and and worship sessions, and through Christian leaders and friends.

Your IFC Journal is intended to help you listen well to what God is saying to you, to record it along with your thoughts and questions, to pray about it, and to obey all that He asks of you.

Monday

¹⁶All Scripture is inspired by God and is profitable for teaching, for rebuking, for correcting, for training in righteousness, ¹⁷so that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.

2 Timothy 3:16-17

The Bible is God's word to us. He reveals Himself to us through his Word. Reading the Bible is how we get to know God. What you believe about the Word of God will affect how you approach it. The psalmist said,

3...the ordinances of the Lord are reliable and altogether righteous. 10 They are more desirable than gold—than an abundance of pure gold; and sweeter than honey dripping from a honeycomb. 11 In addition, your servant is warned by them, and in keeping them there is an abundant reward.—

Psalm 19:9-11

An ordinance is a decree or command that carries the authority of the one who issued it. Here the psalmist refers to the commands of God as being of extreme value, excep-tionally pleasing, and enduringly beneficial.

How do you perceive the word of God? Is it something of value to you? How do you approach your study of the Bible?

God's word is beneficial for us in teaching us about God and his plan for us, in relating to one another as followers of Jesus, and in equipping us to accurately reflect the image of God. As you study God's Word today in your devotion and hear it being taught, re-ceive its instruction warmly and commit yourself to following all that God ask's of you.

Tuesday

"...teaching them to observe everything I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Matthew 28:20

A critical but often overlooked aspect of the Great Commission is Jesus' instruction to His disciples to teach new followers of Jesus **to obey everything he had taught them**. This to some is known as obedience-based discipleship. James, the half broth-er of Jesus, said this about obeying the commands of God's Word:

²²But **be doers of the word** and **not hearers only**, deceiving yourselves...the one who looks intently into the perfect law of freedom and perseveres in it, and is **not a forgetful hearer but a doer who works—this person will be blessed** in what he does. James 1:22,25

Here at Falls Creek this week you are hearing a lot of good Bible teaching and preaching. You are also spending time reading God's Word in your devotions. It is important that you know it is not enough to know God's Word, but that we obey all that he asks of us in every way.

Sometimes the things that God asks us to do can seem overwhelming, and some-times even scary. But there is comfort for us in Jesus' closing statement in the Great Commission. **He gave us a promise that He would be with us always**. Whatever God asks you to do today, you can rest assured that He will be with you and strengthen you for all that He asks.

Wednesday

The Lord came, stood there, and called as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel responded, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

1 Samuel 3:10

God has had a plan from the beginning of time, and the scripture is full of stories of God inviting men, women, boys, and girls to partner with Him in His work. It is a humbling and exciting thing to participate with God in His plan.

Paul wrote, "Therefore, brothers and sisters, in view of the mercies of God, I urge you to pre-sent your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God; this is your true wor-ship." (Romans 12:1) Samuel's mother prayed for years for the ability to have a child. She was so grateful to God for the gift of a son, that she presented him to God in the temple to serve Him all the days of His life. But Samuel was not an unwilling servant of God, he surrendered himself fully to God and His plan for his life.

There have been tens of thousands of people that have come before you to participate in Indian Falls Creek over its 75 years, and God had a plan for everyone of them. Many heard and answered God's call to a life of serving Him right here on these grounds, just as Samuel did so many years ago.

Ask God today to reveal to you His call and will for your life. He will hear and answer your prayer. And when He does, surrender your heart to Him and His will just as Samuel did.

Thursday

18 As he was getting into the boat, the man who had been demon-possessed begged him ear-nestly that he might remain with him. 19 Jesus did not let him but told him, "Go home to your own people, and report to them how much the Lord has done for you and how he has had mercy on you." 20 So he went out and began to proclaim in the Decapo-lis how much Jesus had done for him, and they were all amazed.

Mark 5:18-20

When you have an encounter with God, your life will be significantly changed. Paul said **when we are in Christ, we are new creations!** The old has gone, and the new has come. (2 Corinthian 5:17) That radical transformation happens when you are born again, but also throughout your continual walk with Jesus.

The man from whom Jesus cast out a legion of demons was ready to follow Him immediately. Rather than going where Jesus went, Jesus told him to go home and tell everyone he knew what He had done for him.

Prayerfully, you have heard from God this week and have made commitments to follow Him. You have also been sharing your commitments with your small group. As you prepare to return home, agree with your small group members that together you are going to tell everyone you know about what God has done in you.
