



how some families cannot attend for lack of funds. For a family of four, the cost can be challenging. We understand this. Therefore, the Board of Directors have made ENDOWMENT FUND a commitment to assure that, in the future, no one is denied the opportunity to attend due to finances.

As a camper, you may not always think about what it takes to make this event happen each year. As inflation increases, the cost to maintain the grounds increases. For example, the water system was recently upgraded at a cost of four million dollars. Because Falls Creek Assembly is not funded by Cooperative Program funds, campers must pay a gate fee. Although the gate fee increased slightly this year, it is still very reasonable compared to other such camps.

The Board is creating an endowment fund to provide scholarships for those who need it. To make this happen, we are beginning an endowment campaign. Every dollar we receive in donations will go to the endowment fund through Water's Edge Ministry. An endowment campaign is really a "friends raising" campaign. We will be asking churches and individuals, who believe the ministry of IFC, to support the campaign.
